Music Notes from Ann Coulter

As I think back with gratitude to all of the hard work and beautiful singing and ringing of the St. Paul's musicians during Advent and Christmas, I am enjoying the imagery of **light in darkness** that is so much a part of our lessons and music texts (hymns and anthems) during Epiphany. Traditionally, on the last Sunday of Epiphany, we sing exuberantly joyous music of thanksgiving before we "put away our alleluias" during Lent. This year the last Sunday of Epiphany is also our Confirmation Sunday and Bishop's Visitation, and we look forward to a joyous celebration with special music.

This month, the St. Paul's Choristers will begin their winter term rehearsals. The Choristers and I will be privileged to learn several Nigerian hymns. **Vera Onovae**, a member of our church and mother of three of our choristers, has taught me several hymns that she sang in her Anglican church when growing up in Nigeria. According to Vera, there are two hundred and fifty ethnic groups in Nigeria, and they have their own dialects. These songs are in the Urhobo language, and with Vera's guidance we will try to sing them correctly and share them with you in a service during Lent. I am excited for our congregation to have this link with Christians in a faraway part of our world, and I appreciate Vera's help with this project. 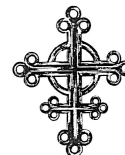

Last weekend, nine intrepid young people from St. Paul's: Gabie Braxton, Brooke and Jack Valentine, Will Carmack, Meredith Cudd, Mary Alexander Patterson, Natasha Billard, Mariah Vaughn, and Henry Thelin, (along with five of our compadres from the St. John's side of our combined youth group) dared to challenge the storm, as well as the "chaperoning" skills of Bootie and Ron Thelin (and Chesley Vohden, St. John's), to admirably represent our parish at Diocesan Council. THE ST. PAUL'S ACOLYTE CROSS: During the 10:30 worship service on Sunday, January 24th, **Fletcher Baldwin, Lelia Burge, Will Light, Jennifer Popper, and David Vaughn** were presented *The St. Paul's Acolyte Cross*. The cross is a miniature replica of the St. Paul's Altar Cross, which was designed by Richard G. Pumphrey of Lynchburg College and manufactured by the James Avery studio, Kerrville, Texas. Each cross included a presentation card, which reads as follows:

The Cross has been universally recognized for centuries as the central symbol of The Christian Faith. This cross is a miniature of the uniquely designed Altar Cross of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Lynchburg, Virginia. It employs elements of St. Paul's architectural setting and symbolizes the faith and worship of the people of this parish in relationship with the larger body of Christians throughout the world. This replica is given in recognition of a faithful commitment to worship services of St. Paul's and in appreciation of Acolyte service and leadership. It is presented to the Glory of God by the people of this Parish and in memory of Scott Barber Randall, a faithful Acolyte from 1974 until 1977.
